Ahoy PPJ fleet members, FRENCH POLYNESIA UPDATE

As you may have heard, foreign-flag yachts are now allowed to move freely among the archipelagoes of French Polynesia, assuming they followed special registration protocols established during the confinement period. However, the French Oversea Territory is still officially "closed" to all arriving foreign travelers until the first week of July, when international flights will begin to arrive again. (Within three days of embarking, all air passengers must be tested for COVID-19.)

We hope — and expect, with fingers crossed — that along with the resumption of flights, FP will also become officially "open" to arriving mariners, as in normal times. But we can't guarantee that, as we have not yet seen this change of policy stated in writing.

We can assure you, however, that business owners and service providers, as well as many government officials, are acutely aware of the importance of sailors' expenditures trickling into the island economies this season. Cruise ship arrivals are on hold indefinitely, and it's anybody's guess how long it will be before hotels and yacht charter operations return to pre-pandemic customer numbers.

It is, of course, quite late to make a crossing from the West Coast, but a few boats still seem to be arriving every week, and asking permission to stay, at least temporarily. We are told that such requests are now being granted with few if any exceptions.

Needless to say, this has been the most bizarre and unpredictable Puddle Jump season ever. While many would-be passage-makers were tremendously disappointed to have had to postpone their South Pacific travels, others who did make the crossing did so with substantial anxiety about the reception they'd get upon arrival. In any case, we are happy to report that life in the archipelagoes is gradually inching back to pre-pandemic normalcy. So we look forward to meeting you, if and when you activate your "Plan B."
